Attendance Matters

Please find your child's attendance information for the spring term. Your child's attendance certificate will be sent on a separate email.

The law entitles every child of compulsory age to an efficient, full-time education suitable for their age. It is the legal responsibility of every parent to make sure their child receives that education. All children have a legal right to a full-time education. **Where parents decide to have their children registered at a school, they have an additional legal duty to ensure their child attends the school regularly.** Children must attend school every day except in a small number of allowable circumstances.

Statistics show a direct link between under-achievement and absence below 95%. Regular school attenders make better progress, both socially and academically. Children with high attendance also find school routines, school work and friendships easier to cope with.

The school works with our allocated EWO (Education Welfare Officer) to monitor each child's attendance at school. We aim for all our children to have between 98-100%. When attendance falls below this, it can become a concern.

If a child's attendance falls below 95%, it shows that the child's attendance is at risk and it will be monitored. It becomes a higher risk when attendance falls below 93%. If a child's attendance falls below 90%, they are considered as 'persistently absent'. In such cases the school will seek to work alongside families to support them in improving attendance.

Our School Day

Our learning starts at 8:45am. All children must be in their classrooms by this time for the register. The school day ends at 3:15pm.

Punctuality

It is important that children arrive at school on time and are ready to learn. Arriving late can mean that a child starts the day unsettled - this also impacts on the other children in the class.

Chelmondiston safeguards and promotes the welfare of pupils and requires all staff and visitors to share this commitment

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Reporting your child's absence

It is the parent/carer's responsibility to inform school when their child is absent. This should be done by calling the office/leaving a message on the school's answer machine or by emailing the office. (Please do not report absence on Tapestry or Dojo as it may not be read during the day). The school must be contacted before 8:45am and a reason must be given.

Medical Appointments

Ideally these will be made for outside of the school day, though we are aware that it can be difficult to get a medical appointment. Appointments for the dentist and optician should be made outside of the school day. For appointments during the school day, parents must request a 'leave of absence form'.

Requesting other 'leaves of absence' in advance

Headteachers can only grant leaves of absence in exceptional circumstances. **Family holidays can no longer be authorised.**

In the **exceptional case** where families know in advance of a reason why their child may not be able to attend school, **they must request a 'Leave of Absence' form from the school office.** This must be **completed**, detailing the reasons.
